




5.1 Everything happened in Egypt just as Joseph said it would. We can see a pattern in Joseph's life that teaches the principle that God makes everything work together for good. Joseph is a picture of Jesus, showing that God takes every tribulation and makes something good result from it.	6.1 God has given us parents to teach us, protect us, and help us. WE need ot learn to respect all those in authority over us. Even when those in authority over us do not see what we are doing, God is still with us; and He sees eall that we do.			
5.2 God wants us to learn to be thankful in all things. Learning to be thankful will pleas God and help us develop a right attitude. Complaining and grumbling are opposites of a thankful attitude.	6.2 God expects us to use wisdom in responding to problems. We must learn to be courteous and polite in all situations; there is never a reason to be rude. It is God who gives us wisdom and understanding in life.
